Three of the popular outings include our annual trips to Rocky Ford (February), Leech Lake (early summer) and Anthony Lakes (September). Other destinations have included Crooked River, Lenore Lake, Dry Falls, Rock Creek (Montana), Tucannon River, and the Deschutes (Oregon). The club attempts to schedule 4 to 8 outings per year and welcomes member suggestions on new places to fish.

Free Classes Offered To Members

In an effort to promote fly-fishing in our local community, we sponsor fly-tying and rod-building classes which are free to members. Non-members are welcome, but there may be a nominal charge to cover expenses. The club can also offer an introductory fly-casting class.

The fly-tying classes are taught by several of our members who will teach multiple patterns that have proven successful in our local fisheries. The rod building classes are offered in the spring and teach the basics and advanced ways of the unique art of rod building.
